# We Wish to See Jesus

"So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus'" (John 12:21).

**A**ccording to several quotation sites on the internet, Johnny Cash once uttered something to the effect of, "anyone who really wants the truth ends up at Jesus." While I'm not a huge fan of the Man in Black, on this particular point he's not wrong. Jesus is truth, and He promised that through the work of the Holy Spirit we would be guided into all the truth. Jesus, the Way, the Truth and the Life is the focal point of our faith. So, when the Greeks approached Philip, they had a spot-on request!

People, whether they ask or even realize it, come to our churches to see Jesus. We train up our little ones, our youth and even our more seasoned folks so that they might always wish to see Jesus. Yet in the world and even sometimes within our own congregations there are myriad impediments to folks seeing Jesus. Sometimes these are self-imposed, sometimes they are not. Regardless, though, when folks arrive, we want them to see Jesus! In Word and Sacrament, we want them to see Him, touch and taste Him, be forgiven by Him and leave with Him.

It is good then that we as congregations take a look at our ministries, our buildings

and even our structures in order to determine if we are erecting impediments to folks seeing Jesus. Years ago when I was still in the seminary, we were invited to come worship at another congregation. We were to do so as if we were first time guests and didn't really know what was going on. The reason for this wasn't to be some clandestine secret shopper looking to infiltrate an errant group or even a type of undercover boss to call people on the carpet for bad practice. In fact, the goal of our time was to simply worship, and while we were worshiping to identify anything that might stand as an impediment to someone else who was doing the same. Some things we noted were easy fixes, such as the way bulletins and hymnals were distributed. Some things were a bit more difficult, such as signage pointing people in the right direction for that particular service. Yet all of these things were good to observe so that nothing would get in the way of the real reason we were there, to "see Jesus." Therefore, I encourage you this spring to engage in a bit of spring cleaning of sorts, and take a look at those things which might be an impediment for some who might come into our midst to "see Jesus."
