- Young adult or singles ministry
- ► Food and clothing pantries

### **Deaconess Internship**

After completing the prerequisite coursework and fieldwork, all deaconess students are placed in a paid internship for one year of domestic service or two years of international service. This time is devoted to the practical hands-on application of theological studies and skills acquired for the delivery of diaconal ministry. Periodic reviews and evaluation of interns provide guidance for their professional growth and development.

Internships may be served in LCMS congregations, institutions or Recognized Service Organizations (RSOs). Each LCMS training program places its own deaconess intern candidates, matching women with placement assignments tailored to the individual skills of the student, ideally providing focus for future service.

### 2 Institutions or Recognized Service Organizations

- ► Chaplaincy care in hospitals, prisons, convalescent homes or hospice
- Parochial schools, child care, elder care or other educational programs
- ▶ Meal assistance, food pantries, soup kitchens
- ▶ Shelters and safe houses
- ► Homes for people with physical or mental disabilities
- Pregnancy or maternity assistance centers

- ► Charitable organizations providing community assistance and spiritual care
- Projects and programs designed for specific groups, such as the bereaved, terminally ill, recovering addicts, troubled families, mentally challenged and those who need counseling
- Specialized ministries, such as deaf ministry, bilingual ministry, cultural ministry and family ministry
- Office specialist, including administration of nonprofit organizations
