

Parent Take Home Pages:

These are sheets that students can take home daily to help communicate what they are learning at camp to their parents at home.

A few important notes about their use:

1. *Why are they in English?* Even if parents can't read English, it reinforces for them the sense that their child learned English that day and this was a valuable camp for them to attend.
2. Ideally, take-home sheets will be bilingual. Your hosts should be able to help you with translation. **DO NOT** use Google translate to translate the content without a native speaker available to edit it.
3. There is also space each day to add any camp announcements. Some camps like to have special theme days where students wear a specific color or dress to match a theme each day. You may also have information about the parent presentation at the end of the week.
4. Typically, you'll need to run off the parent pages after arrival. Most locations won't have the camp announcements finalized ahead of time. Ask what kind of resources are available for duplicating the parent pages.





Day 1: English Bible Camp

Jesus, Who are You?

The Light of the World



Today, your child learned that Jesus is the Light of the World (**JOHN 8 AND 9**). The story of the healing of a blind man shows the power of God to bring light to dark lives. Most importantly, Jesus lights our path to heaven.

Ask your child to tell you more about today's activities, including explaining the craft.

Bible Verse of the Day: "Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life'" (**JOHN 8:12**).

Day 2: English Bible Camp

Jesus, Who are You?

The Bread of Life



Parent/Guardian: Today, your child learned that Jesus is the Bread of Life (**JOHN 6**). Jesus fed 5,000 people with 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish in today's story. Jesus feeds us His Word for eternal life.

Ask your child to tell you more about today's activities, including explaining the craft.

Bible Verse of the Day: "Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life'" (**JOHN 6:35**).

Day 3: English Bible Camp

Jesus, Who are You?

The Door & the Good Shepherd



Parent/Guardian: Today, your child learned about how Jesus is the Door to eternal life and the Good Shepherd that takes care of us. The story of a lost sheep shows how Jesus cares for each of us and seeks us when we are lost.

Ask your child to tell you more about today's activities, including showing you the craft.

Bible Verses of the Day: "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved" (JOHN 10:9).

"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (JOHN 10:11).

Day 4: English Bible Camp

Jesus, Who are You? The Vine



Parent/Guardian: Today, your child learned that Jesus is the Vine. All who are connected to Jesus, like branches to a vine, have life from Jesus.

Ask your child to tell you more about today's activities, including showing you the craft.

Bible Verse of the Day: "I am the vine; you are the branches" (JOHN 15:5A).

Jesus, Who are You?

The Resurrection and the Life & the Way, the Truth and the Life



Parent/Guardian: Today, your child learned about Lazarus, a man who died and Jesus raised to life. In the same way, Jesus gives life to all who trust in Him. He shows us the way to heaven.

Ask your child to tell you more about today's activities, including showing you the craft.

Bible Verse of the Day: "Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me'" (JOHN 14:6).
