Wait On The Lord WEEK TWO

KEY SCRIPTURE:

A verse to memorize and meditate on this week

“Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak” (MATT. 26:41).

TAKING IT FURTHER:

A section of Scripture to ponder in depth

“But [Elijah] himself went a day’s journey into the wilderness and came and sat down under a broom tree. And he asked that he might die, saying, ‘It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my fathers.’ And he lay down and slept under a broom tree. And behold, an angel touched him and said to him, ‘Arise and eat.’ And he looked, and behold, there was at his head a cake baked on hot stones and a jar of water. And he ate and drank and lay down again. And the angel of the Lord came again a second time and touched him and said, ‘Arise and eat, for the journey is too great for you.’ And he arose and ate and drank, and went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb, the mount of God” (1 KINGS 19:4-8).

2. Are there things in this Scripture that remind you of what God in Christ Jesus has done for you or who He has made you to be?
3. What does this Scripture teach us about God’s will in regard to the habit we are focusing on this month?

5. How can you put into action what God has taught you?
