

Parent Take-Home Pages:

These are sheets that participants can take home each day to help communicate to parents/guardians about camp content.

A few important notes about their use:

1. *Why are they in English?* Even if parents can't read English, it reinforces for them the sense that their child learned English that day and this was a valuable camp for them to attend.
2. Ideally, take-home sheets will be bilingual. Your hosts should be able to help you with translation. **DO NOT** use Google translate to translate the content without a native speaker available to edit it.
3. There is also space to add camp announcements. Discuss with your hosts what announcements there will be each day. Be sure to include information about the final presentation at the end of the week. Keep in mind that most locations won't have camp announcements finalized ahead of time, so you should work with your hosts to plan for duplication on site.



Fear not! God does the impossible in Jesus.

Parent/Guardian: Today, your child heard about a very special visit from the angel Gabriel to Mary (LUKE 1:26-38). Jesus did the impossible when He was born as both man and God. This impossible act shows that God can also do the impossible of forgiving our sin and uniting us with Him through Jesus.

Ask your child to tell you more about today's activities, including who else participated.

Today's vocabulary: God, Angel, To say, To love, Holy, To fear, Possible, Impossible

Bible Verse of the Day: "For nothing will be impossible with God" (LUKE 1:37 NRSV).

Fear not! Jesus is the Good News!

Parent/Guardian: Yesterday's announcement to Mary comes true months later with the birth of Jesus. God sends angels to announce the birth of Jesus to local shepherds (**LUKE 2:8-20**). The angels announce that Jesus is the Savior of all people.

Ask your child to tell you more about the day's activities, including the English class activities.

Today's vocabulary: Shepherd, Night, Glory to God, Angel, Peace, Savior, To be terrified, Good News, Manger, Suddenly

Bible Verse of the Day: "And the angel said to them, 'Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord'" (**LUKE 2:10-11 ESV**).

Camp Announcements:

Fear not! Jesus is with you.

Parent/Guardian: In today's story, Jesus has grown up and is traveling teaching the people. He sends His followers ahead of Him in a boat and miraculously walks on water toward the boat later (MATTHEW 14:22-34). One of His followers, Peter, also walks on water by God's power, but Peter begins to sink when he sees the wind and waves. Jesus reminds His followers that He is with them, so there is no need to be afraid.

Ask your child to tell you more about the day's activities, including explaining the craft.

Today's vocabulary: Disciple, Boat, Water, Courage, Faith, Son of God, To be terrified, Wind, To save, To sink, Lake

Bible Verse of the Day: "'Don't be afraid,' [Jesus] said. 'Take courage. I am here!'" (MATTHEW 14:27B NLT).

Camp Announcements:

Fear not! Just believe.

Parent/Guardian: Jesus performs a “miracle sandwich” today as He performs two miracles in the same story. He heals a sick woman and raises a girl from the dead (**MARK 5:21–43**). In the middle of the sandwich, He speaks to the girl’s father, saying, “Don’t be afraid; just believe.” His words are for us too. As we live life on earth, we face challenges of many kinds. Jesus can be trusted to see us through even when things seem hopeless.

Ask your child to tell you more about the day’s activities, including the Bible story.

Today’s vocabulary: Girl, Woman, Faith, Miracle, To be sick, To heal, To live, To die, To touch

Bible Verse of the Day: Jesus told him, ‘Don’t be afraid; just believe’” (**MARK 5:36B NIV**).

Camp Announcements:

Fear not! Jesus lives!

Parent/Guardian: Even though Jesus was loved by many, the rulers had Him put to death based on false accusations. The story doesn't end there, because three days later, He rose again. Jesus shows that He is alive by appearing to some of His followers after His resurrection (**MATTHEW 28:1-10**). Because Jesus lives, the power of death is destroyed, so no one needs to fear death when they trust in Jesus.

Today's vocabulary: To fear, To die, To live, Cross, To be afraid, To rejoice, Angel, Tomb, To Run, Stone, To shake

Bible Verse of the Day: "But the angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, ... [Jesus] is not here, for he has risen, as he said'" (**MATTHEW 28:5A, 6A ESV**).
