(PSALM 108:5)

STRUCTURE

- v. 1-4** The Lord's steadfast love.
- v. 5-6** The Lord's glory is our deliverance.
- v. 7-9** The Lord's conquest of the land.
- v. 10-13** David's plea for victory.

AT A GLANCE

THIS SOUNDS FAMILIAR Psalm 108 combines Psalm 57:7-11 (v. 1-5) with Psalm 60:5-12 (v. 6-13), with only minor changes. However, the combination produces a different tone than either of its constituent parts.

"SHECHEM" A city in the hill country of Ephraim where Abraham built an altar to God (GEN. 12:6).

VALLEY OF SUCCOTH A valley on the east side of the Jordan River around the city of Succoth. Given to the tribe of Dan.

"MOAB" The land of the descendants of Lot. It is east of the Dead Sea.

"EDOM" The land of the descendants of Esau. It is south of the Dead Sea.

"PHILISTIA" The land west of Israel on the Mediterranean Sea.



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Psalm 108 is quite interesting, as it takes parts from two psalms of lament (**PSALMS 57:7-11 AND 60:5-12**) and produces something with an entirely different tone and focus. Far from being a lament, this psalm praises the Lord for His steadfast love, His deliverance of His people and His conquest of the promised land. It closes with a plea to God to valiantly defeat the enemies of His people. David sings of the Lord's steadfast love and faithfulness both among His people and among the nations. The psalm shows that it is God's glory to deliver His people. We see this fully in John's Gospel, as the glory of God is revealed in Jesus on the cross delivering us from our sin. David lists some of the nations that the Lord defeated for Israel in the promised land, showing that God keeps his promises. The Lord who has delivered his people continues to deliver them, and will indeed bring us into the new heavens and new earth.
