"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us" (2 Corinthians 5:17–20).

id you know that, on average, more than 2/3 of people living in rural and small-town areas have no connection to a Christian church? Consider these questions:

- How can congregations deal with the challenges and issues that rural and small-town congregations face and still be faithful to the mission of the church?
- How can we reach out to those lost and wandering in our communities all while dealing with the realities of an aging congregation with seemingly fewer and fewer resources?

These, plus a host of other questions, should be ones we are contemplating on a regular basis. So many congregations have settled into the mode of maintenance or survival. While this might seem like a nice, comfortable place to be, it isn't what our Lord has called us to do and to be about in His church. Whether we are

an aging church in a community with declining population or a burgeoning new start in an area where people are moving in, we have the same call and the same mission ... to be "ambassadors for Christ."

In fact, each and every day we as a new creation in Christ have the opportunity to share the Good News with neighbor, friend, coworker, former members and complete strangers alike. We do so not because we desire to "grow" our congregation's

membership but because it is what we as Christians do.

Consider then, how gathering and contemplating these questions just might spur us to action as the Body of Christ gathered together. How could we use this information and brainstorming to get out and do that work we have before us? Perhaps we might just find that this provides us with the jumpstart we need to be the active and dynamic congregation God has given us the opportunity to be.
