# It's *Still* All About Jesus

**I**n my travels and work with congregations and districts throughout our Synod I have the great privilege to bring support and resources to rural and small-town congregations. In doing this, I am always amazed at the fortitude of so many of these congregations. They have seen wars, internal struggle and external strife; they have lived through good times and bad. Yet, through it all, multitudes have found respite in the comfort of Christ's Gospel proclaimed and delivered in these places.

Yet, too often in today's climate, they have slipped into a feeling of hopelessness, a general sense that they have little to offer the church and the world. What is forgotten here is that it isn't about any particular place or time. In fact, *it's still all about Jesus!* That is what got them this far in the first place, and it will be the hope that sustains them. In fact, it's the hope we are privileged to share with a hopeless world.

Throughout the world, even in our own back yard, there will always be persecution, bloodshed, hatred, malice and evil. Yet, it is our call to continue in the hope of the Lord and to proclaim His loving-kindness to all people. This is why I said in a blog post a couple of years ago, "From LWML to men's clubs, Sunday schools to VBS, youth groups to older adult ministries, these congregations are uniquely



situated to provide hope and healing to areas often forgotten and often ignored. Hardships and roadblocks can make these ministries a challenge to remain viable, but there are many who are addressing this challenge head on. They are creatively maintaining their mission presence so that the lost might hear about Jesus."
