Dear PALS Family and Friends,



If you're reading this as a pastor, can you remember the first time you spoke the Absolution in the Divine Service? “Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the +Son and of the Holy Spirit. What an exciting time of year it is for fourth year seminarians and their families, for District Presidents and Districts, for congregations, and for us here at PALS! May God bless our brand new 2018 pastors and may He use PALS to help them transition into their first call!

We appreciate the time given to us by our seminaries during the final days before Call Day and Graduation.




## Exciting News from the PALS Field



