REV. JONATHAN & ANITA CLAUSING

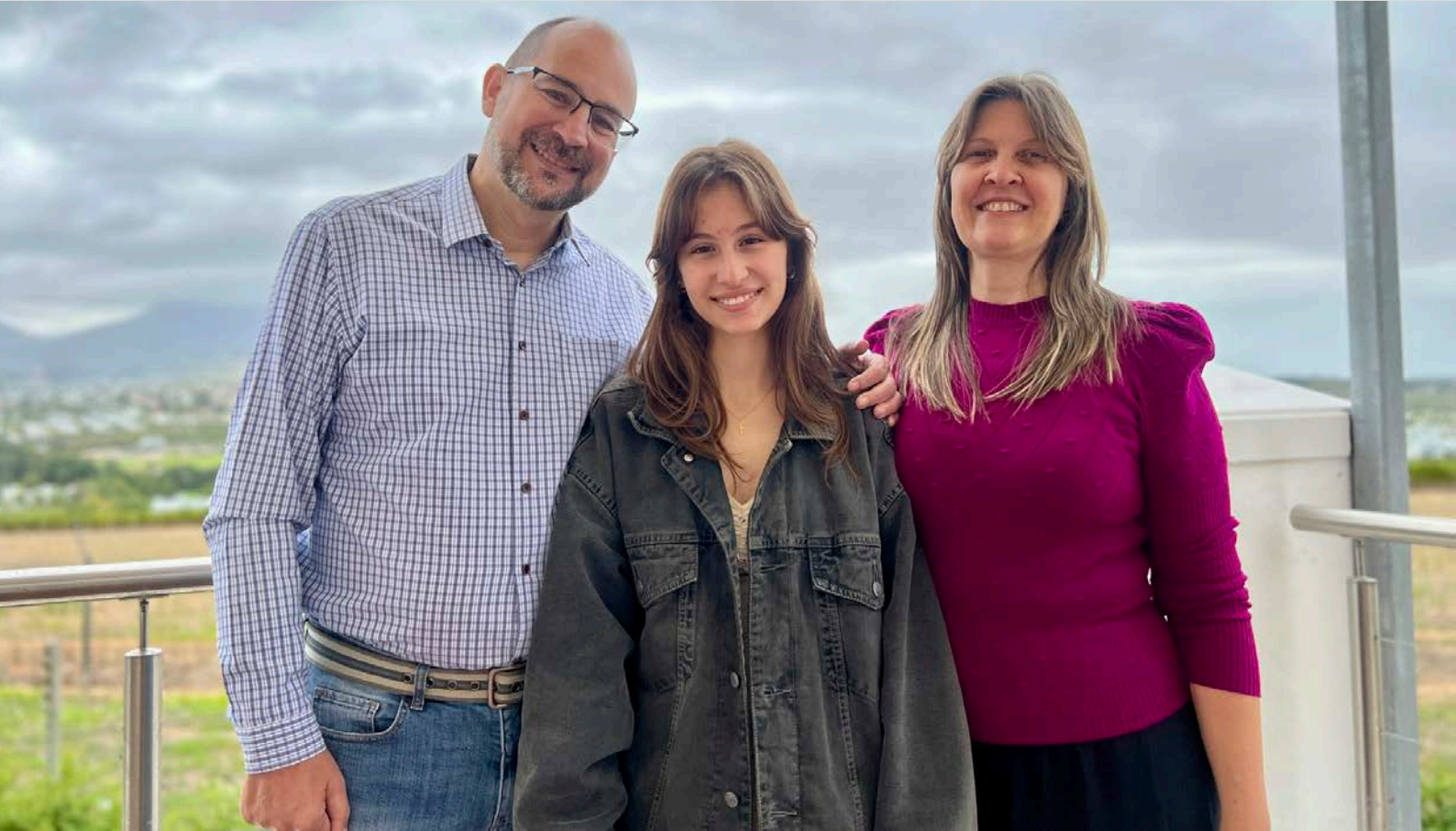
TANZANIA

WORSHIP STRUCTURE TIN ROOFS - AFRICA



Spread the Gospel~Plant Lutheran Churches~Show Mercy



Throughout Africa, congregations typically construct the main structures of their churches using locally available materials such as stones, wood, or baked mud bricks. While they often raise funds for essentials like bags of cement, mortar, and other building materials, acquiring suitable roofing materials remains a challenge. Consequently, the structures may remain exposed to the elements, subject to sunlight and rain, or be covered with thatch roofs requiring constant upkeep and repairs. This project provides the necessary materials to complete Lutheran Churches with tin sheets for roofing. On average, a single piece of high-quality tin sheet costs \$15. The tools required for roof installation, including a hammer, saw, and machete or axe, amount to \$25. The nails necessary for securing the roof cost \$30. Trusses, the wooden structures supporting the roof, are priced at \$100 each. Through the collaboration between the local Lutheran church and the LCMS, these efforts contribute to constructing dry, durable, and enduring spaces where God's people can gather to receive His Word and Sacraments.

The Water Project offers opportunities to supplement local contributions, providing water to meet communities' physical needs and enabling local churches to share God's love and introduce Christ's Living Water to needy communities.

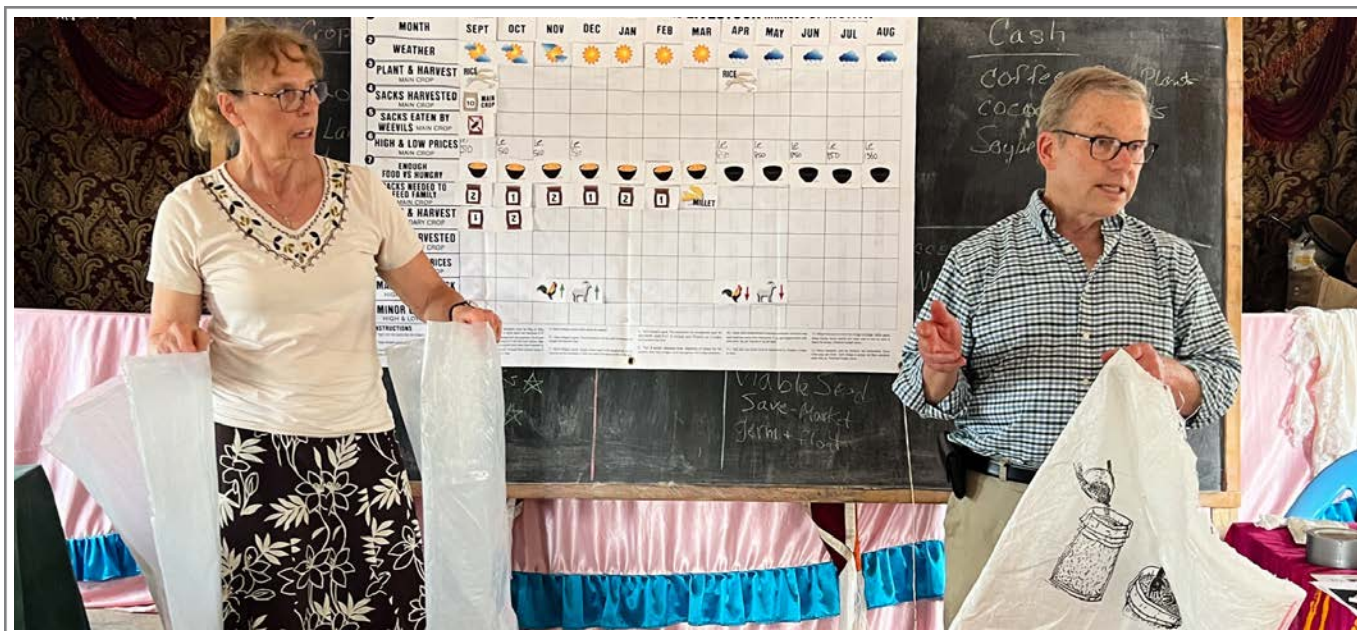

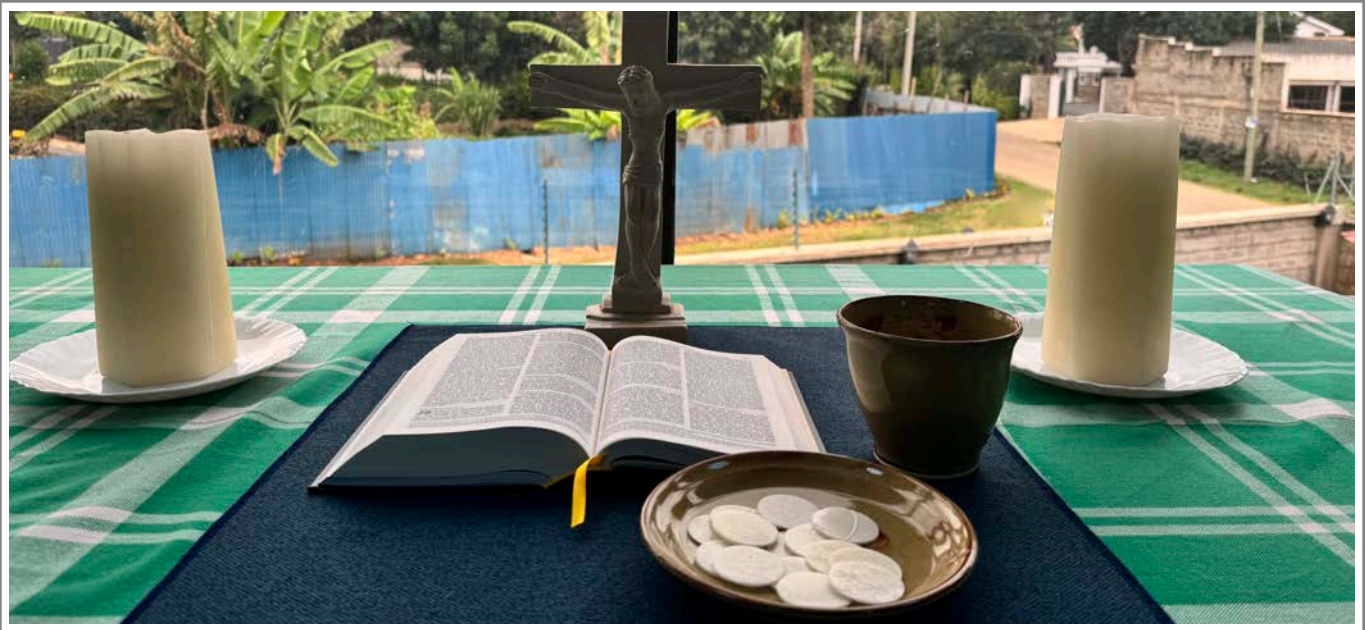

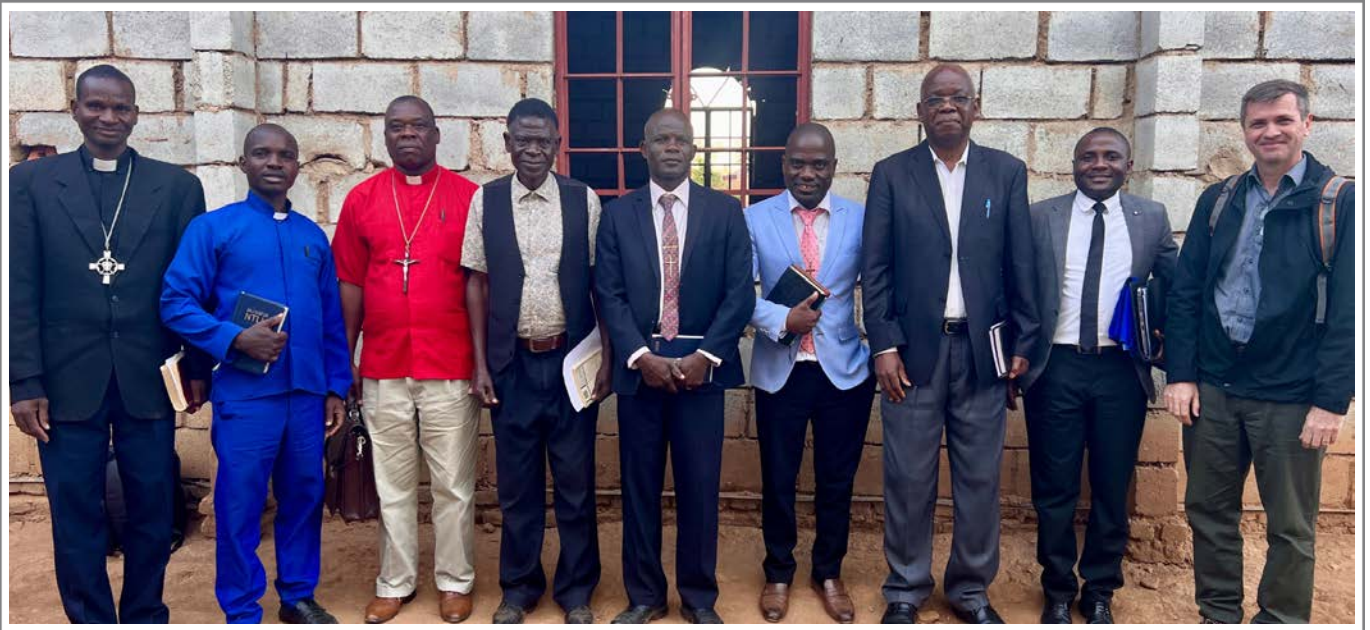
In the refugee camps of Africa, God's people from different tribes and language groups have come together in one place. Lutherans tend to gather and worship together while praying for their distant homes. Lutherans in the refugee camps expressed a need for pastoral visits to receive catechetical instruction, baptismal preparation, and the administration of Holy Communion. This project facilitates the deployment of a local pastor, provided by a local partner Lutheran church, to the camps three times a year for the ministry of the Word and Sacrament. Although these visits may not fully meet the ongoing pastoral needs, they serve as a temporary measure to address the most urgent requirements of the congregations while also preparing their own lay leaders for future seminary studies.

The churches we work with desire to bolster their pastors' capabilities through Continuing Education courses or seminars, specifically emphasizing teaching Lutheran hymnody within the local context. This project aims to facilitate the gathering of pastors, church leaders, and spouses from a particular church body or geographical region. During these gatherings, they participate in courses or conferences led by experienced church leaders, local seminary professors, or missionaries, focusing on their chosen topics. Upon returning home, these pastors are equipped with immediate enhancements in their ability to provide pastoral care to their congregants, preach effectively within their unique contexts, teach hymns to others, and engage with their communities while joyfully sharing the Gospel.

The Mekane Yesus Seminary in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, serves as a training center for pastors within a region encompassing approximately 12 million Lutherans. They offer a comprehensive Master's in Theology program. The Mekane Yesus church oversees nearly 14,700 congregations but has only 4,700 pastors. This project focuses on granting scholarships for individuals to complete a two-year accredited program in Addis Ababa, enabling graduates to assume leadership roles and instruct other pastors in various colleges and training centers. It also addresses the shortage of pastors in the remote areas of this predominantly agricultural nation. The cost for a student to partake in the Master of Theology program amounts to approximately \$2,000 per year.

Brought by refugee pastors and evangelists in the early 1990s, the Gospel soon spread from refugee camps to the local population of Guinea. Since then, this small church body has raised seven men to become pastors, trains the catechism to members, and continues to grow despite the pressure from false religions. The love for the Gospel has led this church to establish a local training center for men to complete their first year of pastoral training before traveling to continue further studies at the French-speaking CLET in Togo. Support for this effort enables scholarships for students to begin this academic year and allows the Gospel to continue spreading in Guinea.
