shield” (PS. 5:1-4, 11-12).

my cup overflows.
Surely goodness and mercy shall

“The LORD is my light and my
salvation; whom shall I fear?
The LORD is the stronghold of my life;
of whom shall I be afraid?” (PS. 27:1).

“Though an army encamp against me,
my heart shall not fear;
though war arise against me,
yet I will be confident.

“One thing have I asked of the LORD,
that will I seek after:
that I may dwell in the house of the
LORD all the days of my life,
to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD
and to inquire in his temple.

“For he will hide me in his shelter
in the day of trouble;
he will conceal me under the cover
of his tent; he will lift me high
upon a rock.

“And now my head shall be lifted up
above my enemies all around me,
and I will offer in his tent
sacrifices with shouts of joy;
I will sing and make melody to
the LORD.

“Hear, O LORD, when I cry aloud;
be gracious to me and answer me!
You have said, ‘Seek my face.’
My heart says to you,
‘Your face, LORD, do I seek.’
Hide not your face from me.

“Turn not your servant away in anger,
O you who have been my help.
Cast me not off; forsake me not,
O God of my salvation!
For my father and my mother
have forsaken me,
but the LORD will take me in.

“Teach me your way, O LORD,
and lead me on a level path
because of my enemies.
Give me not up to the will of my
adversaries; for false witnesses have
risen against me, and they breathe
out violence.

“I believe that I shall look upon the
goodness of the LORD
in the land of the living!
Wait for the LORD;
be strong, and let your heart take

Into your hand I commit my spirit;
you have redeemed me, O LORD,
faithful God” (PS. 31:1-5).

Be still and wait patiently for the Lord

“Trust in the LORD, and do good;
dwell in the land and befriend
faithfulness.
Delight yourself in the LORD,
and he will give you the desires of
your heart.

“Commit your way to the LORD;
trust in him, and he will act.
He will bring forth your righteousness
as the light, and your justice as

the noonday.
“Be still before the LORD and wait
patiently for him;
fret not yourself over the one who
prosper in his way” (PS. 37:3-7A).

God heals the sick

“Blessed is the one who considers the
poor! In the day of trouble the LORD
delivers him;
the LORD protects him and keeps him
alive; he is called blessed in the land;
you do not give him up to the will of
his enemies.
The LORD sustains him on his sickbed;
in his illness you restore him to
full health.

“As for me, I said, ‘O LORD, be gracious
to me; heal me, for I have sinned
against you!’
My enemies say of me in malice, ‘When
will he die, and his name perish?’
And when one comes to see me,
he utters empty words,
while his heart gathers iniquity;
when he goes out, he tells it abroad.
All who hate me whisper together
about me; they imagine the worst
for me.

“They say, ‘A deadly thing is poured
out on him; he will not rise again
from where he lies.’
Even my close friend in whom I
trusted, who ate my bread, has lifted
his heel against me.
But you, O LORD, be gracious to
me, and raise me up, that I may
repay them!
“By this I know that you delight in me:
my enemy will not shout in triumph
over me.
But you have upheld me because of
my integrity, and set me in your
presence forever.

“Blessed be the LORD, the God of Israel,
from everlasting to everlasting!
Amen and Amen” (PSALM 41).

“As a deer pants for flowing streams,
so pants my soul for you, O God.
My soul thirsts for God,
for the living God.
When shall I come and appear
before God?
My tears have been my food
day and night,
while they say to me all the day long,
‘Where is your God?’
These things I remember,

how I would go with the throng
and lead them in procession to the
house of God
with glad shouts and songs of praise,
a multitude keeping festival.
Why are you cast down, O my soul,
and why are you in turmoil
within me?
Hope in God; for I shall again praise
him, my salvation and my God.
My soul is cast down within me;
therefore I remember you”
(PS. 43:1-6).

“God is our refuge and strength,
a very present help in trouble.
Therefore we will not fear though
the earth gives way, though the
mountains be moved into the heart
of the sea,
though its waters roar and foam,
though the mountains tremble at
its swelling. *Selah*
“There is a river whose streams make
glad the city of God, the holy habita-
tion of the Most High.
God is in the midst of her; she shall

not be moved; God will help her
when morning dawns.
The nations rage, the kingdoms totter;
he utters his voice, the earth melts.
The LORD of hosts is with us;
the God of Jacob is our fortress.
Selah

“Come, behold the works of the LORD,
how he has brought desolations on
the earth.
He makes wars cease to the end of
the earth; he breaks the bow and
shatters the spear; he burns the
chariots with fire.
‘Be still, and know that I am God.
I will be exalted among the nations,
I will be exalted in the earth!’
The LORD of hosts is with us;
the God of Jacob is our fortress.
Selah” (PSALM 46).

God is my fortress

“For God alone, O my soul, wait in
silence, for my hope is from him.
He only is my rock and my salvation,
my fortress; I shall not be shaken.
On God rests my salvation and my
glory; my mighty rock, my refuge
is God.
“Trust in him at all times, O people;
pour out your heart before him;
God is a refuge for us. *Selah*”
(PS. 62:5-8).

“I cry aloud to God,
aloud to God, and he will hear me.
In the day of my trouble I seek the Lord;
in the night my hand is stretched
out without wearying;
my soul refuses to be comforted.
When I remember God, I moan;
when I meditate, my spirit faints.
Selah

“You hold my eyelids open;
I am so troubled that I cannot speak.
I consider the days of old,
the years long ago.
I said, ‘Let me remember my song
in the night;
let me meditate in my heart.’
Then my spirit made a diligent search:
‘Will the Lord spurn forever,
and never again be favorable?
Has his steadfast love forever ceased?
Are his promises at an end for all time?
Has God forgotten to be gracious?
Has he in anger shut up his
compassion?’ *Selah*
“Then I said, ‘I will appeal to this,
to the years of the right hand
of the Most High.’
“I will remember the deeds of the LORD;
yes, I will remember your wonders
of old.
I will ponder all your work,
and meditate on your mighty deeds.
Your way, O God, is holy.
What god is great like our God?
You are the God who works wonders;
you have made known your might
among the peoples.
You with your arm redeemed your
people, the children of Jacob
and Joseph. *Selah*
“When the waters saw you, O God,
when the waters saw you,
they were afraid;
indeed, the deep trembled.
The clouds poured out water;
the skies gave forth thunder;
your arrows flashed on every side.
The crash of your thunder was in
the whirlwind;
your lightnings lighted up the world;
the earth trembled and shook.
Your way was through the sea,
your path through the great waters;

yet your footprints were unseen.
You led your people like a flock
by the hand of Moses and Aaron”
(PSALM 77).

Lord, You have been our dwelling place

“Lord, you have been our dwelling
place in all generations.
Before the mountains were brought
forth, or ever you had formed the
earth and the world, from everlasting
to everlasting you are God.
“You return man to dust and say,
‘Return, O children of man!’
For a thousand years in your sight
are but as yesterday when it is past,
or as a watch in the night.
“You sweep them away as with a flood;
they are like a dream, like grass that
is renewed in the morning;
in the morning it flourishes and is
renewed; in the evening it fades
and withers.
“For we are brought to an end by
your anger; by your wrath we
are dismayed.
You have set our iniquities before
you, our secret sins in the light of
your presence.
“For all our days pass away under your
wrath; we bring our years to an end
like a sigh.
The years of our life are seventy,
or even by reason of strength eighty;
yet their span is but toil and trouble;
they are soon gone, and we fly away.
Who considers the power of your anger,
and your wrath according to the fear
of you?
“So teach us to number our days
that we may get a heart of wisdom.
Return, O LORD! How long?”

Have pity on your servants!
Satisfy us in the morning with your
steadfast love, that we may rejoice
and be glad all our days.
Make us glad for as many days as you
have afflicted us, and for as many
years as we have seen evil.
Let your work be shown to your
servants, and your glorious power to
their children.
Let the favor of the Lord our God be
upon us, and establish the work of
our hands upon us; yes, establish the
work of our hands!” (PSALM 90).

His Angels will guard you in the battle

“He who dwells in the shelter of the
Most High will abide in the shadow
of the Almighty.
I will say to the LORD, ‘My refuge and
my fortress, my God, in whom I trust.’
“For he will deliver you from the snare
of the fowler and from the deadly
pestilence.
He will cover you with his pinions,
and under his wings you will find
refuge; his faithfulness is a shield
and buckler.
You will not fear the terror of the
night, nor the arrow that flies by day,
nor the pestilence that stalks in dark-
ness, nor the destruction that wastes
at noonday.
A thousand may fall at your side,
ten thousand at your right hand,
but it will not come near you.
You will only look with your
eyes and see the recompense
of the wicked.
Because you have made the LORD your
dwelling place — the Most High,
who is my refuge —
no evil shall be allowed to befall you,
no plague come near your tent.

“For he will command his angels
concerning you to guard you in all
your ways.
On their hands they will bear you
up, lest you strike your foot against
a stone.
You will tread on the lion and the
adder; the young lion and the
serpent you will trample underfoot.
“Because he holds fast to me in love, I
will deliver him; I will protect him,
because he knows my name.
When he calls to me, I will answer him;
I will be with him in trouble;
I will rescue him and honor him.
With long life I will satisfy him
and show him my salvation”
(PSALM 91).

The Lord is forever

“Hear my prayer, O LORD;
let my cry come to you!
Do not hide your face from me
in the day of my distress!
Incline your ear to me; answer me
speedily in the day when I call!
“For my days pass away like smoke,
and my bones burn like a furnace.
My heart is struck down like grass
and has withered; I forget to eat
my bread.
Because of my loud groaning
my bones cling to my flesh”
(PS. 102:1-5).

My help comes from the Lord

“I lift up my eyes to the hills.
From where does my help come?
My help comes from the LORD,
who made heaven and earth.
“He will not let your foot be moved;
he who keeps you will not slumber.
Behold, he who keeps Israel
will neither slumber nor sleep.

The LORD is your keeper;
the LORD is your shade on
your right hand.
The sun shall not strike you by day,
nor the moon by night.
The LORD will keep you from all evil;
he will keep your life.
The LORD will keep
your going out and your coming in
from this time forth and forever-
more” (PSALM 121).

Out of the depths, I cry to You

“Out of the depths I cry to you,
O LORD!
O Lord, hear my voice!
Let your ears be attentive
to the voice of my pleas for mercy!
“If you, O LORD, should mark iniquities,
O Lord, who could stand?
But with you there is forgiveness,
that you may be feared.
“I wait for the LORD, my soul waits,
and in his word I hope;
my soul waits for the Lord
more than watchmen for the morning,
more than watchmen for the morning.
“O Israel, hope in the LORD!
For with the LORD there is
steadfast love, and with him is
plentiful redemption.
And he will redeem Israel
from all his iniquities” (PSALM 130).

“On this mountain the Lord of hosts
will make for all peoples a feast of
rich food, a feast of well-aged wine,
of rich food full of marrow, of aged
wine well refined.
And he will swallow up on this
mountain the covering that is cast
over all peoples, the veil that is

spread over all nations. He will
swallow up death forever;
and the Lord God will wipe away tears
from all faces, and the reproach of
his people he will take away from all
the earth, for the Lord has spoken.
It will be said on that day,
‘Behold, this is our God; we have
waited for him, that he might save us.
This is the Lord; we have waited for
him; let us be glad and rejoice in his
salvation” (IS. 25:6-9).

The word of God stands forever

“A voice says, ‘Cry!’
And I said, ‘What shall I cry?’
All flesh is grass,
and all its beauty is like the flower
of the field.
The grass withers, the flower fades
when the breath of the LORD blows
on it; surely the people are grass.
The grass withers, the flower fades,
but the word of our God will stand
forever” (IS. 40:6-8).

“You are my servant,
I have chosen you and not cast
you off’;
fear not, for I am with you;
be not dismayed, for I am your God;
I will strengthen you, I will help you,
I will uphold you with my righteous
right hand” (IS. 41:9-10).

God’s activity in history reveals His power

“Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to
Cyrus, whose right hand
I have grasped,
to subdue nations before him
and to loose the belts of kings,
to open doors before him
that gates may not be closed:

I will go before you
and level the exalted places,
I will break in pieces the doors of bronze
and cut through the bars of iron,
I will give you the treasures of darkness
and the hoards in secret places,
that you may know that it is I, the
LORD, the God of Israel, who call
you by your name.
For the sake of my servant Jacob,
and Israel my chosen,
I call you by your name, I name you,
though you do not know me.
I am the LORD, and there is no other,
besides me there is no God;
I equip you, though you do not
know me,
that people may know, from the rising
of the sun
and from the west, that there is none
besides me; I am the LORD, and
there is no other.
I form light and create darkness;
I make well-being and create
calamity; I am the LORD, who
does all these things.
“Shower, O heavens, from above,
and let the clouds rain down
righteousness;
let the earth open, that salvation and
righteousness may bear fruit; let the
earth cause them both to sprout;
I the LORD have created it.
“Woe to him who strives with him
who formed him, a pot among
earthen pots!
Does the clay say to him who forms it,
“What are you making?” or
“Your work has no handles?”
Woe to him who says to a father,
“What are you begetting?”
or to a woman, “With what are
you in labor?”
Thus says the LORD,

the Holy One of Israel, and the one
who formed him:
“Ask me of things to come;
will you command me concerning
my children and the work of
my hands?
I made the earth
and created man on it;
it was my hands that stretched out
the heavens, and I commanded all
their host” (IS. 45:1-12).

Remembering the Lord's compassion

“Remember my affliction and my
wanderings, the wormwood and
the gall!
My soul continually remembers it
and is bowed down within me.
But this I call to mind,
and therefore I have hope:
“The steadfast love of the LORD never
ceases; his mercies never come to
an end;
they are new every morning;
great is your faithfulness.
“The LORD is my portion,” says my soul,
“therefore I will hope in him.”
“The LORD is good to those who wait
for him, to the soul who seeks him.

for the salvation of the LORD.
It is good for a man that he bear
the yoke in his youth”
(LAM. 3:19-27).
“For the Lord will not
cast off forever,
but, though he cause grief, he will have
compassion according to the abun-
dance of his steadfast love;
for he does not afflict from his heart
or grieve the children of men”
(LAM. 3:31-33).

“And Jesus went throughout all the
cities and villages, teaching in their
synagogues and proclaiming the
gospel of the kingdom and healing
every disease and every affliction.

the way.’ And the disciples said to him,
‘Where are we to get enough bread in
such a desolate place to feed so great
a crowd?’ And Jesus said to them,
‘How many loaves do you have?’ They
said, ‘Seven, and a few small fish.’
And directing the crowd to sit down
on the ground, he took the seven

loaves and the fish, and having given
thanks he broke them and gave them
to the disciples, and the disciples gave
them to the crowds. And they all ate
and were satisfied. And they took up
seven baskets full of the broken pieces
left over. Those who ate were four
thousand men, besides women and
children. And after sending away the

War, famine and earthquakes

for my sake will save it. For what does
it profit a man if he gains the whole
world and loses or forfeits himself? For
whoever is ashamed of me and of my

ashamed when he comes in his glory
and the glory of the Father and of the
holy angels” (LUKE 9:23-28).

The call to repentance

“There were some present at that very
time who told him about the Galileans
whose blood Pilate had mingled with
their sacrifices. And he answered

Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans, because they suffered in this way? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish” (LUKE 13:1-5).

Whoever believes my Word has life

“Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life” (JOHN 5:24).

Jesus is the Light of the world

“Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, ‘I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life’” (JOHN 8:12).

I came that they may have life

“The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly” (JOHN 10:10).

I give them eternal life, and they will never perish

“My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father’s hand” (JOHN 10:27-29).

I am the Resurrection and the Life

“Now when Jesus came, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days. Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles off, and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to console them concerning their brother. So when Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, but Mary remained seated in the house. Martha said to Jesus, ‘Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you.’ Jesus said to her, ‘Your brother will rise again.’ Martha said to him, ‘I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day.’ Jesus said to her, ‘I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?’ She said to him, ‘Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world’” (JOHN 11:17-27).

Let not your hearts be troubled

“Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father’s house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way to where I am going.’ Thomas said to him, ‘Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?’ Jesus said to him, ‘I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me’” (JOHN 14:1-6).

Suffering produces endurance

“Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God’s love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

“For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person — though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die — but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us” (ROM. 5:1-8).

Just as Christ was raised, we too might walk

“We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life” (ROM. 6:4).

Count yourselves as dead to sin and alive to God

“For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

“Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions. Do not present your members to sin as instruments for

unrighteousness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness” (ROM 6:10-13).

Heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with Him

“For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, ‘Abba! Father!’ The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs — heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

“For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees?” (ROM. 8:14-24).

The Spirit of God is with you in suffering

“For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

“Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the first-born among many brothers. And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified” (ROM. 8:18-30).

“For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies” (ROMANS 8:22-23).

The Holy Spirit intercedes for us

“Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose” (ROM. 8:26-28).

Nothing will be able to separate us from God's love

“What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died — more than that, who was raised — who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written,

‘For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered.’

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord” (ROM. 8:31-39).

Comforts us in all of our afflictions

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God” (2 COR. 1:3-4).

We are given over to death so life in Jesus is manifest

“Always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you” (2 COR. 4:10-12).

Affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory

“So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal” (2 COR. 4:16-18).

Christ is our strength

“But he said to me, ‘My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.’ Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me” (2 COR. 12:9).

God chose us in Christ

“Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight” (EPH. 1:2-8).

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. feet,’ have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom, which he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor man. Are not the rich the ones who oppress you, and the ones who drag you into court?” (JAMES 2:2-6).

Trials test the faith

We are born again to a living hope

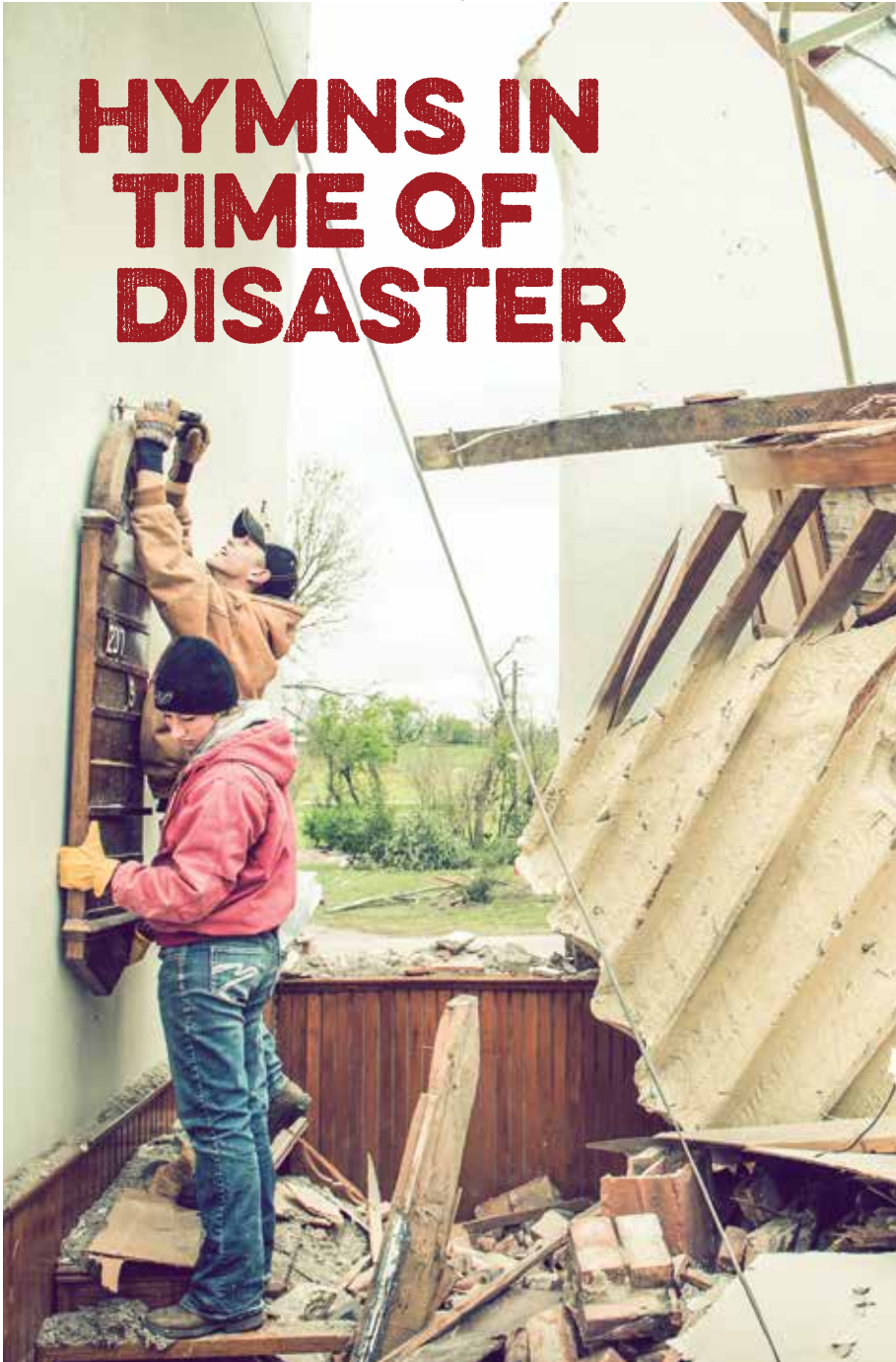
